
# **Identity Book List** - EYFS and KS1


## Sunflower Sisters by Monika Singh Gangotra and Michaela Dias-Haves

A glimpse of three women dressed as mermaids leaves one boy filled with wonder and ready to dazzle the world.




#### Eyes that Kiss in the Corners by Joanna Ho


