Summer 1

Dear Families,

Next half term, our Theme will be 'The World'. They will explore maps and globes, talk about the different countries and the weather differences around the globe.

We will be talking about the different countries that some of us might have been to and where we might like to go. The children will be involved in discussions about similarities and differences between countries.

Our value will be Respect. The children will think of different times in their life when they have been respectful of others and what they could do better to do this more often.

Our Talk4Writing model text will be Peter and the Wolf. The children will learn this story and innovate their own. They will practise their writing skills by making their own story maps basing the story around their own characters and ideas.

In Maths, the children will continue to use a range of maths manipulatives to practise their cardinality skills. They will look at the composition of numbers and continue to develop their understanding of one more and one less.

We will also look at data handling, using our likes and dislikes to create whole class pictograms and talk about what we can find out from the information.

Swimming starts for Andersen Class this half term. The children will be taught by qualified swimming instructors with school staff supporting around the pool and in the changing area. Attenborough will have swimming in the next half term.

School Value

This half term, we will focus on the value of 'respect.' We will learn about respect for ourselves and respect for other people and our world. We will focus on respect for our environment and how small actions can protect our local and global environment.

We uphold every person as a unique and worthy individual. Each should be empowered to function and thrive in their roles, whatever those may be.

Swimming—Andersen Class
