Dear Families,

This term we will be starting our new theme Stories, Rhymes and Morals. Through this theme, children will learn about the world through a range of stories, they will unpick the difference between fiction and non-fiction and start to explore what can be learned through the power of stories. This will include learning about the past, present and lives of others. The children will be reading and listening to a range of traditional tales and rhymes, including those from different cultures.

As a focus within this theme, children will investigate a variety of ways to tell stories through use of pictures, oral retelling and role play. Children will also have the opportunity to design, make and use their own puppets in story telling.

We will also have a focus on morals and rules. Children will continue to learn how to work alongside their peers respectfully and ensure they are demonstrating the school values.

Our class focus story will be The Ugly Duckling by Hans Christian Andersen. This will support us in finding out more about the author that Andersen class is named after.

Our model text this half term is Billy Goats Gruff; this is the text we will need to learn fluently. This will be taught through the use of story maps and actions.

To enhance our learning, we will be walking into Thetford town to visit our local Library.


