Dear Families,

In Summer 1, the children started their theme: The World. They have explored animals and the different habitats around the world. Next half term, the children will continue with the theme of The World. Exploring where we are in the world, maps and globes.

Our value this half term was Respect. The children were able to think of different times in their life when they have been respectful of others and what they could do better to do this more often. The children used the word respect in their everyday life in the classroom.

Andersen Class have shown excellent independent skills through getting themselves changed for swimming.

During the Spring Term, the children worked on The royal Opera Houses Alice in Wonderland dance project. The children explored the different characters, how movement can be used to represent these, feelings and personalities. The project ended in Summer 1 with a showcase at the Carnegie Rooms, where both classes performed their dance to other attending schools.

Reception also started a very exciting project which saw 5 chicks hatch! The children have loved watching them grow and often sit to read to them.

In Summer 2, our model text in T4W will be 'The Princess and the Pea. The children will be learning the text, exploring adventurous Vocabulary and innovating their own story.

The children have also got a visit to South Angle Farm to look forward to . Here, the children will meet different animals and find out about life on a farm.

School Value

This half term, we will focus on the values of 'friendship' and 'trust.' We will be developing our teamwork skills and reflecting on our friendships in and out of school. We promote the development of caring individuals who support each other and explore how to work together for the greater good.

Swimming—Attenborough Class
